Welcome and Introductions

Sandy welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited introductions around the room. Sandy read through the minutes of the last meeting and everyone agreed they were an accurate representation.

Chris Twydell – Volunteer for East Kent Sands

East Kent Sands is a Charity entirely led by volunteers that support anyone who has been affected by the death of a baby. Sadly, 15 babies a day die in the UK, it is more common in deprived areas and Mum's from Black and Asian communities are at higher risk.

Sands offer many things, including free bereavement training to Midwives, memory boxes for bereaved families. Through their fundraising efforts they have been able to support the opening of a new specialist bereavement suite in Margate and donation cuddle cots to allow families to spend more time with their baby. They also offer employer packs, support groups and have set up the country's only Baby Memorial Garden in Ashford.

Most of Sands volunteers have a personal experience of baby death and work hard to fundraise and raise awareness. Last year they raised £20,000. Bobby from the CCG asked if they are looking to expand into Swale. Chris said they would like to eventually have support groups in all major towns.

Lauren Mounsey and Anita Brunt Sheppey Lifestyles

Sheppey Lifestyles is a three year Big Lottery Funded project with three strands – Community Chefs, Community Gardner, Youth worker.

The Community Chefs are working on various things including 'Anxious Diners, Happy Diners' for families affected by ADHD. Cooking classes for 8 to 11 year olds at after school club, teaching them about making healthy choices, handling food and knives and cleaning up after cooking. Once a week they deliver Level 2 in Hospitality and Catering at Standford Hill prison. A new project for vulnerable and isolated members of the community called

'Let's do lunch' is free of charge and transport is included. It encourages the social aspect of eating and people will also be encouraged to assist in the kitchen.

The Community Gardener, Anita grows some food for Chef to use and is running level 1 in horticulture at Standford Hill. They are also working with schools and playgroups. Anita is also setting up communication with care homes and taking planting activities to dementia groups.

Lauren the lead youth worker is running DofE at New Road Youth Club on the Isle of Sheppey. They have young people completing the Bronze Award. They run healthy cooking activities with a peer mentoring aspect. She is also running 4 weekly health activities and setting up an in-house radio in Eastchurch.

They also have a Sheppey Lifestyle radio show every other Monday from 10 to 11 to discuss all things food, gardening, youth work and healthy lifestyle.
